Drugs that are contraindicated in Parkinson's:

The term "contraindicated" essentially means the drug in question should not be given to a patient. In the parkinsonian, the basic problem is the chemical nature of the disease itself. Many drugs alter the brain's dopamine system and may not be recognized as having the potential to markedly alter the symptoms of Parkinson's simply because the drugs are often used for treatment of non-neurological conditions.
